Pastor Karis Message

#### Luke 1:46b-55

46b "My soul magnifies the Lord,

47 and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

48 for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed:

49 for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

50 His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.

51 He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts.

52 He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly;

53 he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty.

54 He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy,

55 according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants.

Mary is my rock star! Here's a teen that's not married. No doubt, the religious folk assured her she was "less than" in God's eyes for bearing a child out of wedlock. Yet, there is Mary, staring down with hope those that mock her for being within a hot mess of a situation. She will be called "blessed" not "banished".

The way Mary responds is mind blowing, actually. Not only did she deal with the religious holier than thou's, but she was living during political turmoil with a narcissistic King. Heaven forbid, there might be room at the table for someone greater than the ruler of the day.

That's what we know. I've often wondered about the more practical things that Mary endured as she ushered in our Messiah. Did she suffer from morning sickness? How did Jesus behave in her belly? Did she have the right size maternity wear? Was she often tired during the third trimester?

Mary is most inspiring because of how she responds to the impossible—She experiences and recognizes the Holy in the middle of no fairy tale story. Everything goes hay wire in her life and yet she sees God there.

Mary embraces the moment. She recognizes God is bigger than her mind every imagined. She labors forth a God that performs love for what the world calls "lowly".

What if we found ourselves in Mary's situation today? How would we respond?

Don't think for a moment that in 2023 our situation is not be somewhat similar. Think about it—

The scripture says, "He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty."

When Jesus shows up today, he does so during the days of oppressive empires-- through acts of compassion and love for others. When narcissistic politicians say it's all about them, the Holy arrives to divert salvation to the hungry, giving them good things. When corruption is rampant, the Sacred finds a way to stand in the universe to intervene, sending the rich away empty.

Mary brings all of us a message of hope this Christmas, 2000+ years later. That God is with us in the middle of the most surprising of situations, in places that aren't of fairy tales and during the most inopportune times.

We had a very busy November. Thank you to all who generously donate food for the Thanksgiving holiday. What a crazy day that was when we gave out turkey and fixings to 92 families. December is gearing up to just as busy. The Christmas pantry is 12/19/23 and we will be adding home made cookies, candy, and roasting chickens. All are welcome to give us hand.

Once again, Thrivent is matching funds with food donations. So, every item that is donated we will receive a dollar up to \$250. And don't forget the Reverse Advent Calendar food boxes. Each day pack an item from the list and we will collect them on Christmas Eve. Please, put your box in Pastor Karis's office. The prayer resource calls for justice and peace, especially for churches impacted by the war in the Holy Land, and for lifting up Palestinian Christian communities and ministries and the congregations and institutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem.

In a <u>letter</u> to accompany the <u>Advent</u> resource the leaders write, "We call, and pray for, an end to the war in Gaza, Israel, and the West Bank. We call for a ceasefire, an end to violence in the West Bank and the opening of humanitarian corridors in Gaza."

The church leaders contributed prayers for the four Sundays of Advent, focusing on the themes truth, justice, peace and hope.
