Pastor Karis Message

It was 1940. A young black child was walking through the street holding his mother's hand. They were living in South Africa under the days of Apartheid. It was the law that a black person who passed a white person on the street should step aside and let the white person pass. The child and his mother saw a white man approaching them. They prepared to step aside, when, to their surprise, the white man stepped off the sidewalk and tipped his hat to the child's mother in a sign of respect and honor.

The kid was shocked. He and his mother walked down the center of the sidewalk and smiled at the man. "Mother," he asked, "Why did that man stand aside for us and tip his hat? I thought that white men didn't do that? Why didn't he want us to step aside?"

"Because, my son, that man is a man of God," his mother answered. "That man is a priest."

It was then and there that her son decided what he would do with his life. He too would become a priest. His name was Desmond Tutu.

I often think about those that feel insignificant at sometime or another.

The women in Jesus' time must have felt such, too. The same women that ran to tell those huddling in fear about seeing Jesus after his death. Their culture tried to mute them. Yet, God called the "insignificant" to be the first to announce "lesus is risen".

It is often among those deemed insignificant that we encounter God in the most powerful ways.

Bible Study Discussion

The next Bible discussion will be Wednesday, May 1st, at 11 am in Luther Hall. We will discuss "Inspired" by Rachel Held Evans. The book can be purchased for \$11 on Amazon.

If the Bible isn't a science book or an instruction manual, what is it? What do people mean when they say the Bible is inspired? When New York Times bestselling author Rachel Held Evans found herself asking these questions, she embarked on a journey to better understand what the Bible is and how it's meant to be read.


~What she discovered changed her - and it can change you, too~

Evans knows firsthand how a relationship with the Bible can be as real and as complicated as a relationship with a family member or close friend. In Inspired, Evans explores contradictions and questions from her own experiences with the Bible, including:

- Δ If the Bible was supposed to explain the mysteries of life, why does it leave the reader with so many questions?
- Δ What does it mean to be chosen by God?
- Δ To what degree did the Holy Spirit guide the preservation of these narratives, and is there something sacred to be uncovered beneath all these human fingerprints?
- Δ $\,$ If the Bible has given voice to the oppressed, why is it also used as justification by their oppressors?

Drawing on the best in biblical scholarship and using her well-honed literary expertise, Evans examines some of our favorite Bible stories and possible interpretations, retelling them through memoir, original poetry, short stories, and even a short screenplay.

Undaunted by the Bible's most difficult passages and unafraid to ask the hard questions, Evans wrestles through the process of doubting, imagining, and debating the mysteries surrounding Scripture. Discover alongside Evans that the Bible is not a static text, but a living, breathing, captivating, and confounding book that can equip us and inspire us to join God's loving and redemptive work in the world.



Come join us every first and third Wednesday of the month at I pm for an afternoon of fellowship and fun.


We play the game 'hand and foot'.

CIVIC LIFE AND FAITH

CHURCH ST STATE AVE

The ELCA is developing a social statement on civic life and faith, the relationship of church and state, and related matters, as called for by the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly.

Social statements are the ELCA's primary documents to address significant social issues. They are intended to aid reflection, shape conscience and set forth the ELCA's teaching and policy on the major social issues and questions of contemporary life. Social statements are developed by task forces, using an established process of study and widespread participation across the church to guide theological and moral deliberation.

At this time the task force encourages you to study and give feedback on a <u>draft version of the social</u> <u>statement</u>. You can participate by filling out a survey, <u>found here</u>, or by participating in a hearing in your synod, if available. Hearings are public gatherings where participants share their specific affirmations or concerns about a draft statement.

To find out if your synod will host a hearing, or to learn how to host one, please <u>email us here</u>. The feedback period will be open until Sept. 30, 2024.
