The articles will be picked up occasionally by Alan King who will deliver them to the Lord Baltimore Lions Club in Ocean View.



Did you know that Community Lutheran Church has a Mission Endowment Fund?

The purpose of the mission endowment fund is to provide for mission work beyond the operational budget of this congregation.

Per Article 8 of the church's bylaws:

The Mission Endowment Fund of Community Lutheran Church ("the Fund") is authorized by the Constitution (C5.05). Christian stewardship involves the faithful management of all the gifts God has given to humankind - time, talents, the created world and financial resources, including accumulated, inherited and appreciated resources. Christians can contribute to the ongoing outreach work of the church through many avenues including bequests in wills, charitable remainder and other trusts, charitable gift annuities, assignment of life insurance, and transfers of property (cash, stocks, bonds and real estate). It is the desire of the congregation to encourage, receive, and administer these endowment gifts in a manner consistent with the loyalty and devotion to their Lord expressed by grantors fully in accord with the Constitution, Bylaws and Continuing Resolutions. The purpose of the Fund is to enhance the mission outreach of CLC apart from the general operation of the congregation and that no portion of income generated by the Fund will be used for the annual operating budget of the congregation. All principal amounts contributed will always be retained and only the investment income will be expended on outreach projects. The Mission Endowment Fund Managers shall be responsible for the management of the Fund with the duties, responsibilities and operations of the committee set forth in the Continuing Resolutions.

The Rev. Sandra R Mackie of Gettysburg, PA, worked for more than 20 years as an RN, first in the intensive care arena and later as a psychiatric nurse.

She has a Masters Degree in Counseling from the University of Delaware as well as a Master of Divinity degree from Lutheran Seminary at Gettysburg. She served as an ordained pastor in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Mackie served as an Intentional Interim Pastor. In this role she worked with congregations between settled pastors to assist them to name and resolve congregational conflicts.

Pastor Mackie has completed training to work with survivors of domestic violence and sexual abuse. She is also a trained and experienced Spiritual Director in the tradition of Shalem Institute

for Spiritual Direction, working mainly with other pastors.

Mackie has traveled to Israel with Gettysburg Seminary as well as participated in an Olive Harvest Delegation to Palestine with InterFaith Peace-Builders (IFPB), now Eyewitness Palestine.

She joined a Civilian diplomacy Delegation to Iran with the Fellowship of Reconciliation (FOR) and later led an FOR Civilian Diplomacy Delegation to Iran.

Networking, advocacy, and public speaking in support of a just peace in the tradition of the teachings of Jesus are central to Mackie's work.

Seeking God's peace through spiritual formation is Mackie's vocational focus. Peacemaking in the tradition of the teachings of Jesus and other great religious leaders is her passion. Sharing information around intercultural and interfaith work is central to her life's work.

Coming soon! Online Directory for Community Lutheran Church

Every so often, our paper membership directory gets picked up by scammers who then use that information to send out fake pleas from "Pastor Karis" asking for gift cards for her to distribute. (Pastor Karis will never ask for gift cards from you by text or email!) Securing your personal information and yet making it available to others in the church is a delicate balancing act. But we've found a solution!

Church Center is a website and a phone app (Android & Apple) directory. A directory is a private place for the people in the church to share their contact information. Only people invited to the **directory** can see the others or share their information. Each invited person can choose the information they want to show about themselves or their household.

Our council members have tried it and find it to be simple to set up and easy to use.

Best of all ... it's free!

In the future, we will be able to use this directory portal for other church-related items, including a calendar, donation form, groups, and registration for events.

But let's not get ahead of ourselves. The first step is to create the directory. Here is how that will happen:



I. You will soon receive an email invitation asking you to sign-up for the directory.

2. It will come from no-reply@churchcenter.com

3. After pressing the blue "Join Directory" button, you will be prompted to follow the steps to create an account and add the information you want to

have shared (Name, Phone Number, Address).

4. If you encounter any problems, you may contact me at:

5. You may download the Church Center app to your phone. This is our

unique setup QR Code for the Church Center app.



Some have asked how to get their photos onto the new online directory. It's easy! Go to the Church Center app on your phone.

At the very top of the screen tap the icon to the right of the bell.

Click on the top panel (My profile & settings)

Click Contact and profile information

Click Update Photo and follow the prompts.

Remember, having your photo available helps us to get to know one another.

Some have asked about phone numbers showing up in the directory.

For security purposes those haven't been shown yet.

Council will be discussing this at the next meeting.

In any event, you get to determine what information is shared in the church directory through the settings you mark within the app.

Bishop Eaton Expresses Disappointment

I am disappointed by the Supreme Court's decision in <u>Grants Pass v. Johnson</u>, which clears the way for onerous civil and criminal penalties for unsheltered neighbors forced to sleep in parks or on other public property. This could jeopardize the work of Lutheran ministries and organizations dedicated to helping people experiencing homelessness. As a church, we are called by God's grace to love and serve the most vulnerable and marginalized neighbors in our

communities.

As a church, we can:

I. Learn and Engage: Let us educate ourselves about housing insecurity and about justice for the homeless. Visit the <u>ELCA Homeless and Justice Network</u> for more information.

2. Pray: Let us use the ELCA's Homeless and Justice Ministries <u>dedicated devotional guide</u> to pray for those affected by this decision and for our ministries that work to secure shelter for those in need.

3. Speak Out: Let us review the <u>ELCA World Hunger resource on housing</u> and engage in activities to support effective policies, such as writing a letter to a local news outlet or speaking out at a town hall. Criminalizing homelessness is an injustice we must reject. We remain committed to advocating for our unhoused neighbors.
