With this next pastor, we are poised to move to the next level — growing in participant numbers and other ways we've never experienced before!

Many of you who have been part of Community for some time know how diligently we've worked not only to grow but also to become financially sustainable — aiming to meet Synod compensation guidelines for our pastors. This shift has been deeply encouraging. We're witnessing a transformation — from a mindset of scarcity to one of abundance. We're growing spiritually, and with that comes a renewed culture of giving.

Looking ahead to this next season of ministry, I'm especially excited about expanding our presence into other geographic areas. As I walk the streets of Rehoboth, Lewes, and Milton, I often meet people who are excited about the possibility of Community Lutheran being a part of their neighborhoods. While Frankford can feel like a trek across the ocean (especially in summer traffic!), the growth we're seeing in Milton and Lewes is real — new developments are bringing in new residents, and we're noticing a shift toward younger and more diverse populations. Personally, I look forward to entering a new rhythm of truly part-time ministry. As many of you know, I have been living with a rare type of sarcoma cancer that doesn't respond to chemotherapy or radiation. When first diagnosed, the prognosis was not hopeful. Yet, by the grace of God, I remain full of life — and for that, I am grateful beyond words.

One key to continued health, as my doctors have reminded me, is reducing stress and managing demands wisely. That's why I'm embracing a season of writing, secular public speaking, and working to establish a Community Lutheran presence in other parts of our area. It's a different chapter, but one that fills me with passion and purpose.

I am truly on fire to see the incredible work a new pastor will lead in Frankford — and I look forward to laying the groundwork for new expressions of Community in places where the Spirit is

already stirring.

Congregational Meeting

Vote on Pastor Carla Christopher's & Pastor Karis Graham's calls

Sunday, August 24 after the 10:30 a.m. service

There will be no 8:45 service that day.

During the past month, we have been blessed with the presence of Pastor Carla Christopher. She has enthusiastically embraced Community by leading worship, meeting with various ministries of the church, leading an informative workshop on Juneteenth, and facilitating insightful workshops on "Planning to Plan" with the church council. Pastor Carla delicately balanced her role as short-term interim for Pastor Karis with her discernment on how she could utilize her gifts to enhance the mission of Community in the future.

Because of our unprecedented growth and expanding vibrant ministries, we need to expand our pastoral staff. On Sunday, July 13th, the Council held a beautiful and spirit-filled meeting with Pastor Carla, during which she shared her thoughtful observations from her month at Community. The Congregation Council received a recommendation to issue a call to Pastor Carla. After some deliberation, the council approved presenting this potential call to the congregation. A Congregational meeting was scheduled for August 24th for the purpose of voting to extend a call to Pastor Christopher and to modify the call for Pastor Karis Graham. The Delaware-Maryland Synod will send a representative to oversee the vote. On August 24th, we will have only one service at 10:30 a.m. The vote will take place immediately after that service.

Meanwhile, the final details of the "call package" are being negotiated so that by the time of the congregational vote, all details will be in place. Information related to the call will be made available to members of the congregation as they are finalized.

Community Church is extremely fortunate to have found a pastor with a wide range of experiences and whose vision and passion match our own. Her expertise as a pastor, curriculum writer, conference leader, workshop leader, and community organizer makes her one of the top leaders in the country for mission development. Pastor Karis is excited about the possibility of working with Pastor Carla. She believes their skills complement each other, and together they would lead Community into its future.

In addition to her MTS, she holds a Bachelor's degree in Peace and Conflict Studies from Swarthmore College and a Master of Arts in Ethics, Peace, and Global Affairs from American University. She previously served in Cambodia with Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) as a Peace Program Support Worker


and earlier participated in MCC's Serving and Learning Together (SALT) program in Jordan—a

Some non-perishable food items are also sometimes on the list, and we try to find the best prices.
