A thought from the garden: St. Abigail and the buzz of relevance



Lately, the lavender in our garden has been buzzing—literally. The bees have returned in full force, working busily among the blooms. Their presence reminded me of a lesser-known but remarkable figure in Roman Catholic tradition: St. Abigail, also known as St. Gobnait or Deborah, the patron saint of beekeepers.

Abigail lived in 6th-century Ireland. As a young girl, she fled a troubled home in search of peace and purpose. According to tradition, an angel guided her to a place where nine white deer grazed, a sign that she had found her spiritual home. There, she established a religious community dedicated to caring for the sick, often using honey as a healing remedy.

She became deeply associated with bees, not just as a keeper, but as a protector. Legends tell of her commanding swarms of bees to defend her village from raiders. Her bond with these tiny, vital creatures continues to inspire.

In our own time, with environmental concerns growing, particularly the crisis facing pollinators like bees, St. Abigail's legacy takes on renewed meaning. She calls us to see the natural world not as a resource to be used up, but as a sacred trust. Her life encourages **ecological stewardship**, **healing**, and **compassionate service** to others.

St. Abigail may have lived over a thousand years ago, but her values care for creation as a Jesus follower. Perhaps, as we watch the bees at work, we're also being invited to rediscover our own roles as caretakers of a shared and fragile world.


Night 2: July 9th from 7 - 8:30 p.m.

from a variety of sources.

We receive generous donations from individuals, community groups, and businesses, including Mountaire (400 lbs of chicken per month, packaged by Hockers), Family Butcher, Harris Teeter, Old World Bakery, Surf Bagels, and Weis. Some neighborhoods and communities also organize drives to collect donations for our pantry.

We also order food from the Food Bank of Delaware. This has been a wonderful blessing, as many items are free, and others are available at about a 50 percent discount. On average, we can purchase nearly a ton of food for around \$200.

In addition, we receive financial donations from several organizations, including St. Martha's, Frankford Presbyterian, Samaritan Thrift Store, and ACTS.

Another important source is you! The pantry receives an allocation from the church's Plan for Ministry, which is funded by the members and friends of Community Lutheran Church. We use those funds to purchase food and personal care items from the Food Bank of Delaware, as well as from Aldi, dollar stores, and other retailers as needed.

The Food Pantry Ministry is seeking volunteers who are willing and able to go out and purchase food and supplies for the Pantry. Reimbursement is available for approved items. Things we regularly shop for include produce (usually on Sundays or Mondays, just prior to the pantry dates), as well as cleaning and personal care items, which are typically sourced from dollar stores. Some non-perishable food items are also sometimes on the list, and we try to find the best prices. If you enjoy finding a good bargain and have some time in the evenings or weekends to shop, contact Mona, Susan, or Katie to request a list of things to buy.



The next pantry is July 1st, from 10 to 12. Volunteers are welcome to come around 8:30 for set-up. We will also serve lunch after the pantry for all volunteers, so plan to stick around for some food! Thank you for all you do to serve the community!
