In smaller churches, one staff member might oversee large groups, but in medium to large churches, it's crucial to break into smaller, manageable groups for better care and growth. Lay shepherds, with proper support, can care for smaller groups, ensuring people are nurtured and engaged. Thus, we will be starting


Additionally, ministry staff must shift from being generalists to specialists, focusing on specific
